Fulbrigh Lecture Series 2003

The 2003 Fulbright Lecture Series brought seven American Fulbright professors who were teaching at German universities in summer 2003 to Rostock. The guest speakers lectured on their special field in American Studies, addressing issues in history, literature and popular culture.
